CRO Corner

I would like to remind all AGC members about the safe handling of firearms at any range. If a shooter is to fire on a range that is controlled by a flag such as the 100 Yard, 200 Yard and .22 silhouette ranges at the AGC, they may not, under any circumstances, handle, touch, carry, move, clean, stroke, play with or in any way make physical contact with any firearm when the flag is down. I am not trying to be humorous with my last sentence, I really want all who read this to understand; I have corrected people before for handling a firearm when the flag was down and was actually told "well...I was not handling the rifle, I just moved it". I have seen many folks headed from their cars ready to shoot or to their cars after they have shot with weapons in their hands when the flag was down. When approaching or leaving a flagged range, pay attention to the position of the flag and act accordingly as far as carrying your firearms is concerned. This is very simple folks; flag up = OK to touch firearms, flag down = NOT OK to touch firearms. I have seen too many people handling rifles while on a cold range (flag down) in the last few days for comfort. I do not know how to be any clearer. I witnessed a group of 6 or more shooters standing around another shooter who was handling a rifle with the flag down. Not one person in the group caught and corrected the error. That tells me none of the people present, were paying attention and that is a very dangerous situation when mixed with firearms. If you are to shoot on a flagged range USE THE FLAG. Yes, even if you are the only one at the range. It is also the responsibility of ALL AGC members to brief ALL their guests about the rules of the club, safe gun handling, the rules of the specific range to be used and the proper handling and operation of any and all firearms to be used that day. It would be advisable to brief the guests prior to even setting foot on club property as well. If an RO or any other AGC member or guest sees a person handling a firearm while the flag is down please correct them immediately in a firm but courteous manner.

A properly cased firearm may be taken to or from a flagged range when the flag is down because in all aspects the shooter is carrying a case and not a firearm. Once at the range however, a person may NOT remove the firearm from the case until the flag is UP (Hot range), otherwise the shooter just transitioned from handling a case to handling a firearm. Make absolutely certain all firearms are unloaded, bolts or actions are open or locked to the rear and any magazines are removed from the weapon prior to proceeding to any range flagged or not. Always carry the unloaded firearm with the muzzle completely down or up, pay attention to the muzzle and never sweep anything or anyone. The sport we all enjoy and partake in at the AGC is unlike any other sport I know of, a mistake at the AGC can end a life in the blink of an eye. We all need to pay attention and act in a safe manner at all times while on club property. Don't get complacent or distracted please keep your mind on the task at hand. Have a safe and enjoyable March.

RO Class

The Aurora Gun Club (AGC) offers the opportunity for members with two years of membership or more to become a range officer (RO). As an RO you will help keep the AGC running safely. Every hour worked will reduce the RO's following year's dues by \$8.00. To become an RO one must attend an RO class, in so doing, the member becomes "certified" by the AGC as a Range Officer. This certification is by and for the AGC only and is not affiliated with the National Rifle Association (NRA) however, the AGC RO class I lead, is based upon the NRA CRO class materials. The Second RO class for 2010 will be held Sunday March 7, 2010 at 10:30 AM in the class room building at the club. Expect classes to last between 1 and 2 hours depending on number of people who attend and amount of questions asked. Classes are low key, informative and hopefully interesting. Be prepared to take notes for your future reference.

Please note: if you were/are an RO, your certification is good for only 2 years. If you wish to continue to be an RO you must retake the class every 2 years. The AGC BOD set a mandate in 2008 that from then forward, ALL discipline chairmen/women (or their designated representative/s) must also attend an RO class every 2 years. Attendance will be taken and recorded.

Letter from Sable Altura Fire Rescue

In the event of an emergency at the Aurora Gun Club, The Sable Altura Fire Department recommends the following:

First stay calm!

Call 9 - 1 - 1 from a call-box or cell phon

Be prepared to give the following information to the call-taker:

The nature fo the emergency, and how long ago it happened

The age/gender of the victim/victims

The address or approximate location of the emergency

Any special or unusual circumstances involved (i.e.: a locked gate, sparking power line, etc)

If you are calling 9-1-1 from a cell phone, immediately tell the call-taker that you need to be connected to the Adams County Dispatch Center, and that your responding agency is the Sable Altura Fire Department. Cell phone calls often land in a regional center and the call-taker may be in another city or county. We understand that this can cause a delay; however – calling 9-1-1 is the only way to guarantee that emergency responders will be dispatched to your emergency. Please do not attempt to call the Department directly to report and emergency as responders may not be in the quarters at all times.

The Department does not recommend that first aid be given by anyone not trained to do so, as this may cause a more serious injury to the victim. In the event of certain emergencies, 9-1-1 operators are trained to coach callers with certain procedures and care.

The Department does periodically offer C.P.R. classes; and for those residents who would like more advanced emergency medical knowledge, Colorado First Responders.
