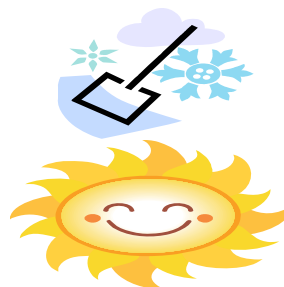

Relocation Committee Report
 March 9, 2010

The following is a summary of the committees' fact finding on the feasibility of relocating the club and its facilities. The findings are presented in a general nature to provide an overall picture of the basic parameters in considering the viability of relocation. A true cost analysis is beyond the scope of this report and would require the skills and expertise of many professionals.

Land Acquisition

The committee has reviewed property along the I70 corridor from the Colfax split east to Bennett and along Quincy Avenue from Aurora Reservoir to Bennett.

The criteria used to find land was to find parcels as close (within 5 miles) to the main road as possible and that the parcel contained at least 320 acres.

The cost per acre ranged from approximately \$1,000 to \$60,000. The land closer to the main roads, and therefore utilities, was the most expensive.

The parcels with the lower prices were further from the access roads and were in a flood plain which obviously eliminates the potential for residential development.

Comments regarding the lower priced parcels:

1. Flood plain land means there are normally creeks that run through the property. The creek channels cannot be altered due to county drainage plans. That means the location of the creek in relation to the potential club facilities will be critical.
2. Most of the flood plain property will require dirt to be brought in for range construction.
3. The inexpensive property will require longer private access roads some up to 3 or 4 miles.
4. Electrical service was very accessible to one parcel, but generally would require a minimum of at least a one mile run.

Development Costs

These are general estimates to develop vacant ground derived from engineers, real estate people and business entities. They are not absolute and of course be revised up or down based on many variables and differing criteria.

Actual Construction Costs

The few individuals who currently do most of the work for maintenance and improvement of the clubs grounds and facilities can not be expected to become the contractors in building a new club. Liability issues and safety along with construction progress schedules / time lines require a construction company to build the larger part of a new facility.

Conclusion

The committee makes no recommendations. This information is provided to the Board of Directors to utilize in their future decisions. The larger question remains "Where will the money come from for land acquisition, development expenses, construction costs, and debt service for future years in addition to annual maintenance costs?"
