BOARD MEETING MINUTES 3/10/2020

Meeting called to order at 7pm by President, Tom Desmond

Present: Baker, Boyd, Caraway, Desmond, Faingold, Kohler, Leiker, Quiring, Whitesides

VII. MEMBERS FORUM

Quilts of Valor Foundation – Randy Still introduced Jan Weber with Quilts of Valor Foundation. Jan spoke briefly about Quilts of Valor. The foundation was formed by Katherine Roberts in 2003 when her son went off to service. She was a nurse, mom and quilter. Katherine had a dream to make a quilt for her son to take with him, a piece of home to give him comfort. Since then the foundation has given away over 248,000 quilts. They gave away 88 quilts in 21 ceremonies in 2019. Mission is to give every vet a quilt to honor them. One of the hardest parts of their work is getting Veterans to let them honor them with a quilt. Their goal is to make sure that every living Veteran receives a quilt. Board Member, Emmanuel Boyd was pleasantly surprised as he was recognized and honored by the Quilts of Valor for his 27 years in the Army at the board meeting. Thank you for your service Manny! The Quilts of Valor would like to honor more of our members that are Veterans and wish to hold a ceremony at the club. The Aurora Gun Club presented a check in the amount of \$200 to Jan at the meeting to support the great service that they are doing.

Steve Chagolla – Steel on the 200-yd. Steve stated that he is aware of several members that would like to see the steel targets get shut down but there are also several members that do not want to see it shut down. He hates to see the club take away things that many members really enjoy. He asked if the berm area can be built up around the east side of the range? He printed a Google map of the range to present to the board to show how the club runs at an angle and that shows the open distance on both sides of the club. Chris Baker asked how the club should police the range to make sure that the correct ammo is being used. It was discussed that Range Officers will need to check the shooters ammo. There is already a rule in place regarding only using lead bullets. Jacketed bullets are NOT allowed. The Rules Committee needs to clarify in the rules. Terry Humbargar asked Steve to ask at the board meeting about putting something in pistol berms regarding no handling of firearms behind the most forward active shooter in the berms. It was also discussed that they need to decide who else can be in the charge of the ROs when Terry and Bill are out.

Carla Smith—Suggested including the rules with the New Member Orientation packet and possibly giving the new members a quiz at orientation for the rules. This would give members some incentive to read the rules when joining. The quiz would include questions on rules that if not followed correctly could potentially get the club closed down.

Mel Caraway – As stated at a previous meeting, he suggested again that adding a statement to the guest envelope to have the member sign and hold them accountable for the guest in knowing the club rules.

Fred Smith – Asked about the Hunter Ed Course and if they gave some kind of test. It was discussed and explained that the course and test are done online prior to the classroom portion.

VIII. OLD BUSINESS

Financial Report — The financial report was given by Loren Kohler. February revenues were \$29,937 and our expenses were \$18,969 leaving a gain of \$10,968. Our YTD revenue is \$47,177 and our YTD expenses are \$43,532 leaving a gain of \$3,645. Account balances: Checking Account \$46,984; Payroll Account \$13,772 and Chase Savings Account \$417,472; Bank of the West Money market account \$151,112; Edward Jones CD – closed. Bank of the West CD \$204,179; Chase Bank CD \$ 200,639. Carla working on separating the orientation fees vs membership fees. Loren will keep an eye on Waste Management, Suburban Propane and some other regular maintenance expenses such as Town N Country and Home Depot. Tax return has been finalized.

Maintenance Update – 2nd VP of Maintenance, David Faingold – The club's water is being tested by Axiom. Trees will be planted soon with a tree planting device which digs the holes. We will rent the device. He got new flags and gutters for the silhouette range. Trenching will be done on the east side to make sure water goes down. Will be buying lumber for the 200-yd target stand. An email was sent out to notify members that work on the target stand will be done on March 18th and 19th. Got the lock on the trailer and lock on the gate fixed. Talked about adding another extension on the 100-yd range. Dave Leiker does not feel it is necessary to put another cover. He was at the club the other day and there was only one shooter under the cover and several in the open area. Chris Baker would like to see another cover on the east end of the range, but not covering the whole range. It was stated that it is louder to shoot under the covered range. Tom Desmond said that he would like to see about putting noise insulation barrier in the ceiling or panels during the April Work Party. The Work Party is scheduled for Saturday, April 25th at 8:00am. If any members have a gas-powered leaf blower that could be used to help with the clean-up, they would appreciate them bringing them to the Work Party. David Faingold thanked Dave, Sonny, Steve, Randy, and Tom Foster for getting the trap machines ready for the ATA match this coming weekend. The club would like to thank Randy for letting the club use his trailer to store old trap machines while we wait for authorization to send them back.

Asphalting Parking Lot Review – 2nd VP of Maintenance, David Faingold – GRC Consulting spoke to David and brought crew out there to evaluate. GRC Consulting provided a bid of \$115,000 to cover the range from one end to the other. The question was asked if the bid included removal of the existing asphalt, resurface and drainage to help with massive puddles. Michael – stated that last time they hired an expert who said that it would be done well, and it wasn't. He is hesitant to vote for it again. David F – Met with this new company and went over everything with them. A drain will be put in the areas that need it. The company assured him that everything would be covered and done well. There will be an additional 2 inches of asphalt and base put down where needed. Last time repurposed asphalt was used but will not be used this time. There was concern expressed about breakage of the edges of the asphalt going into the berms. Dietrich brought up the point that most ranges just have gravel and that they could do a lot more with \$115,000 to remodel the clubhouse and other improvements to update the club, opposed to doing a parking lot. Some modifications can be made so the asphalt will meet up with the gravel in the berm areas, so decrease breakage. Chris – Also mentioned that the boundary sign in berm 3 needs to be moved forward to match the west berm.

New Membership Update – Carla Smith – This year has been a bit of a struggle with offering memberships to people on the wait list, as many do not respond back and many others have said yes to joining, but are taking a long time to get their paperwork turned in. We currently have 15 that have said yes, but still have not sent their paperwork. The question was asked that if not all who have said yes join, do we continue to make calls or cut it off at this time? Chris said that the Orientation on March 21st would be the last one, so whoever signs up for that date can join and no need to make any additional calls.

IX. NEW BUSINESS

Incident Report – No Reports

Request Committee to review 2019 Financials – Loren asked for an announcement for the newsletter stating that the board is looking for a few members to review the club's financials for 2019. The review would take place on Saturday, April 18th 9:00 am in the club house.

NRA Action Pistol – Bob Daneker – Stated he would like to run 2 NRA Action Pistol matches this year on Saturday, June 27 and Saturday, October 24 in berms 1 – 4, putting a stage in each berm with steel in berm 3 and 4. They are currently charging \$2.00 per member and \$8.00 for non-members. He asked the board if he would need to increase the fee. The board stated no, because he was not needing anything additional. and stage would vary from 50 yards that would be the longest. Then 35 yards and 2 - 25 yards. First match (wet run) and working with NRA 25 – 30 people.

3.10.2020 c. Motion that we approve the NRA Action dates June 27th and October 24th.

Electronic Document Signing – Chris Baker is researching the option of using a system to sign new member and renewal paperwork electronically. He submitted an online request and got a call back from the company stating they would put him in touch with the non-profit division. He will continue to follow up and get more information on the process/cost. He asked to have the topic added to the next month's agenda under Old Business.

Manny Boyd – Thanked everyone for the honor of receiving the Quilt of Valor that evening.

Michael Quiring – Had a question about financial report data. Loren stated that they have just always followed the format that's in place.

Loren Kohler – The stock market has been down, which is a good time to buy stocks. The club made \$9,000 in interest last year and feels they could do better in purchasing stocks. He asked the board their opinion about investing. He could get money out of savings to purchase the stocks now while the market is down. If more specific details were included with the investment there could be more discussion about it but felt that an amount could not be allotted without more information.

A motion was initially made to put \$125,000 into the market. Motion was rescinded.

David Faingold - He is a member of the Colorado Gun Collectors Association and asked if perhaps a date could be added to the calendar that the club could merge with the association and do a shoot at the club. This is up for consideration. Adding to New Business for next month.
