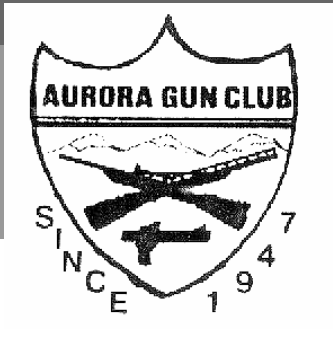

IV MEMBERS FORUM

Doug Ruegg said he had the paperwork filed with the CMP for our club's affiliation with that organization and gave the CMP the AGC match dates for 2009.

Jess Adams greatly appreciated the fact that may AGC members came to the funeral service for his wife, and thanked the AGC for all the sympathy and support they have offered him and his family. Jess also stated that the newsletter should be continued as it is. He has been a member for many years and has seen great value in the newsletter. Membership has always included the mailing of a monthly newsletter and that should not change.

Fuji Silva asked for some rebar to support some 3D archery targets that he picked up for the range.

Bill Chin addressed the board about the newsletter. He wants the BOD to strongly rethink changing the way the newsletter is published and distributed. He feels we should continue publishing the newsletter, mailing it to the membership and keeping it available electronically as well. Over 600 members have the letter delivered to their homes via mail. Many of the members do not have means to receive the newsletter electronically and look forward towards receiving the newsletter in the mail.

Gary Ames presented the Board of Directors with a petition listing 29 AGC club members. The opening sentence of the petition was as follows "We, the undersigned below wish to express our TOTAL disagreement to the board of eliminating our newsletter." BOD member Mike Miller asked Gary who authored the petition. Gary stated that he was the author. BOD Miller pointed out that the opening sentence was totally false and misleading. Mike said: At NO time had any member of the BOD said or implied the intent to eliminate the newsletter. The members of the BOD were asked if this was correct and ALL concurred. BOD Miller again

pointed out that the petition was false and misleading and that many of the names were not signatures but, names listed with member number. Gary stated that he had spoke to the individuals on the phone and had permission to list their name and number. Gary stated that he maybe had miswritten the document. It was pointed out that false and misleading statements leads to many problems and turmoil for the club. At the March BOD meeting the discussion of the delivery (electronic, USPS etc.) of the newsletter was tabled until the April BOD meeting. NEVER was there mention of elimination of the newsletter.

Dean Ames brought up the point that in the minutes of 3/10/2009 the newsletter's mailing and distribution methods was going to be discussed. Dean wanted to make it clear that even the possibility stopping the mailing of the newsletter is a logical reason for AGC members to be concerned and thus discuss it during the members forum of the BOD meeting.

Bill Chin agreed the written portion Gary's petition could have been worded more clearly, without the implication of stopping the newsletter all together. Bill voiced he thought no malicious content was intended.

Jess asked the members present if any was in favor of stopping the mailing of the newsletter. Fuji responded that we could make the newsletter available at the club for any members that wished a hard copy. Technology is moving forward and many people could receive the newsletter via email or the website and that mailing may not be needed.

Pete Benoit stated the electronic / web version of the newsletter usually had at least a 1 week lag behind the mailed form of the newsletter. This lag had cause mix ups in the schedule in the past and was unacceptable. A major portion of the Admin. Assistant's job is the production and mailing of the newsletter. Pete asked if the club eliminated the mailing of the newsletter was the administrative assistant position also to be eliminated?

Harold Lee reminded Gary that when Gary called him about the petition, he told him it was misleading and contained false information because he was at the March meeting and heard nothing about eliminating the newsletter. Harold said the petition was creating a non issue and that was why he would not sign it.

V FINANCIAL REPORT

For February 2009 total revenues are at \$16,206.33, expenses were \$15,945.81 the net change was a positive \$1,137.54.

VI OLD BUSINESS

President, Terry Humbargar:

Terry introduced Anna the new clubhouse manager. Anna wished to thank all the AGC members for their patience with her while she is learning the job.

Terry also handed out the financial statements to the BOD so they could look it over and discuss the statements at the next BOD meeting. Mark posed two questions to the CPA during the meeting based on the expense report. There was a miscellaneous figure in the report which Mark asked to be defined. The CPA told them the "misc." expense was the salary of the administrative assistant. The second clarification was for an amount paid to the fencing company for the new fence.

Terry opened the discussion of the newsletter. Mark read a letter he received from an AGC member who called for a general membership vote on any action we might take to modify the production and dissemination of the newsletter.

During discussion about the newsletter:

Deb reiterated that the notion of total elimination of the newsletter was never discussed or implied.

Martin reread the exact verbiage of the minutes from last month concerning the newsletter. He also expressed his opinion that he too felt any change in procedure in distribution of the newsletter be decided by a general membership vote and not a BOD vote.

Mark stated that he did the math and that well over 97% of club revenue left to run the club after subtraction of the costs to produce and mail the newsletter.

Dave also presented the BOD with material costs the club incurs to produce (not mail) the newsletter (toner, copy costs etc.) and compared our present cost to the costs of having the newsletter produced by an outside source. The cost to outsource the newsletter is at least 10 times our material costs. Dave felt we should continue to produce and mail the newsletter.

Deb suggested dropping the notion of stopping the mailing of the newsletter and to keep the newsletter and its distribution just as it is. No official action was taken on this open discussion.

1st Vice President Emanuel Boyd:

There were 35 new members that attended the last orientation class. He encouraged the new members to take part in any and all activities the AGC has to offer, as well as to share their expertise with the present club members. He also stated there would be one more orientation class to come with 25-30 new members to attend. Reminded the BOD he would like to have the 4th of July as a free hotdog day.

2nd Vice President, Joe Benskin:

Joe was contacted by the company that will install the overhead covers. They will be here April the 20th. Joe purchased the concrete and is ready to get the holes dug and the caissons pored and set prior to the 20th.
