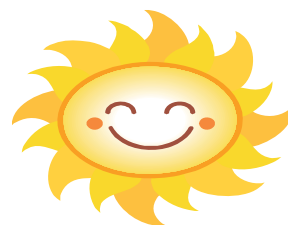

### GUEST FEES PAYMENT BOX

As per the AGC member rule number 31 "members may bring a maximum of four guests at one time. A fee of \$3 per guest will be charged for the additional non-family member guests and the member is responsible for payment. Members with guests can only use one shooting position on any rifle or pistol range." Rule # 30 states " A member may bring his/her spouse and children under 18 to the range plus one other guest free of charge." We have added a payment box at the north end of the caretaker house by the garage door. Members are now required to pay for their guest BEFORE shooting. Follow the directions on the lid of the box and deposit your envelope in the slot. The board of directors passed the following motion regarding payment. It will be strictly enforced by the club. "AGC members will abide by rules 30, 31, and 32 as written in the AGC General Member Rules. Guest fees will be paid BEFORE shooting at the Guest Fee Station. Failure to do so will result in the range officer or caretaker collecting DOUBLE fees from the member on the first offense. Repeated offenses will be referred to the BOD for discipline." ### CRO's Corner

For the month of May I would like to review targets with the membership and their guests. When you shoot at the Aurora Gun Club remember there are only three things we can shoot at. They are paper, clay and steel. By paper we mean printed paper targets, clay targets are clay pigeons and steel means steel plates, gongs or silhouettes. Do not shoot at anything else. That means don't bring your trash to shoot up at the AGC. Take some time to construct a proper target frame as all ranges except the 200 yard range require members to bring and use their own target frames or holders. Frames should be constructed of wood or some material that bullets will not ricochet off when they strike the frame. By adding creativity to your target construction and lay out the day can be that much more enjoyable.

You may affix clay birds to target frames with tape, clips or by some means but do not place clay birds on the horizontal 2x4 supports at the 200 yard range. By doing so any low miss blows out the target frame. That is considered destruction of club property. Do not shoot at the 200 yard target frame itself; do not shoot at benches, tables signs or anything that is not a target (paper, clay or steel). We continually find club property destroyed by bullets. The AGC is your club as much as any other member's keep it neat and well maintained.

The key to any target placement and construction is that the bullet must strike in the middle of the back berm after it passes through the target. Please "eyeball" all targets before you fire by placing your head at the same height as the muzzle of the firearm will be when you are actually shooting. If you can look through the target and visualize the path of the bullet into the middle of the back berm you are good to go. If not, you need to adjust your target/target stand height, placement or firing position. If you are shooting at steel you should be using lead cast or frangible bullets only. Jacketed bullets present a greater danger of ricochet. If you can angle the steel plate slightly downward facing where you will be shooting from, this causes the bullets to be deflected in a more downward manner once they strike the plate. All targets need to be placed as close to the back berm as possible when using any of the 7 fifty yard/"pistol" berms or the magnum handgun range, on the CENTER of the 4'x4' plywood backers on the 200 yard frame or in any of the tire stands on the 100 yard range. Please read the range rules and follow them, even if you have done so many times in the past.
