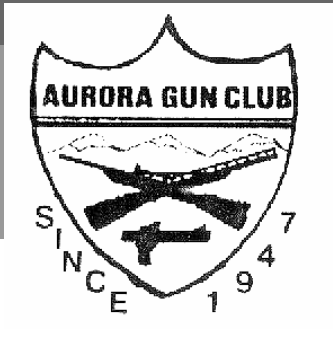

V FINANCIAL REPORT

VI OLD BUSINESS***President, Terry Humbargar:***

Terry asked about the 2009 financial review, the BOD was to review from the last BOD meeting, and if there were any questions. Dave asked why postage doubled in one year. Mike explained that the new postage machine cost and the postage are combined in one figure this year. "Office expense" in the review was also defined by Mike per Dave's request. Under the category "miscellaneous" in the report, Cal's & Kimberly's wages were included among other things.

Mark spoke with the discipline chairs and the reports figures do not match the listed amounts in the report. Mike explained that those expenses fall under the "miscellaneous" category as well. A request was made to clarify the individual expenses by itemization and easy to read categories/descriptions on the financial reviews/audits. An attempt to greater clarify the expenses will be made through better itemization.

Terry stated that the individual disciplines must collect the proper amount from all guests and turn those funds into the club. Non-members need to pay the nonmember price for entry to the club/matches/and trap fees. It is the discipline Chair's responsibility to ensure fees are correctly charged, collected and turned in. Don spoke of trap fees.

Mike and Terry clarified Trap fee schedule. Clarification; From this point forward, all AGC members and their immediate family members, which includes spouses, children and grandchildren 18 or under, will pay the AGC member trap fee/s, all other guests will pay the guest fee/s for shooting trap.
