ATA Chairman Loren Kohler: No ATA shoot on June 20, 2010 because of a conflict with the ATA State shoot. Loren asked that the ATA shoot be moved to June 27, 2010.

VI. OLD BUSINESS

President, Terry Humbargar:

A special meeting of the Board or Directors of AURORA GUN CLUB (AGC) was held on June 1, 2010 at 301 South Gun Club Rd., Aurora, CO 80018. The meeting was called to order at approximately 7:00 p.m.

1. The following Directors were present in person or by proxy (where noted): J. Benskin, M. Benskin, H Braton (P), D. Caldwell, D. Bonner, E. Boyd (P), M. Harper, T. Humbargar, and R. Still.
2. The following Directors were absent: Boyd, Braton
3. The following other persons were present: Scott Levin, Carolyn Abrahams, and Harold Lee.

4. After determining that a quorum was present the following discussions were had and/or actions taken as indicated:
 - (a.) A report to the Board was presented by AGC legal counsel, Scott Levin and Carolyn Abrahams or Sweetbaum, Levin, & Sands, P.C. pertaining to the ongoing negotiations between the AGC and the City of Aurora for the AGC granting to the City one or more easements along Gun Club Road, for the installation of a waterline and related improvements by the City, including the relocations of the existing Xcel Energy utility lines and one or more other dry utilities (collectively the "Waterline Project"). The Board reviewed copies of a draft of the Proposed Agreement between AGC and the City relative to the Waterline Project, which Proposed Agreement provides for the payment of compensation to the AGC for the easement(s) and provides for the payment by the City of various costs and expenses for restoration, relocation, and repair to the AGC property and facilities. Question and answer discussion followed the presentation to the BOD. Following the discussion:
 - (b) The following Motion was made by Randy Still and seconded by Debra Caldwell: "THE MOTION THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS VOTE TO APPROVE THE PROPOSED AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE AGC AND THE CITY: and THAT THE PRESIDENT OR VICE PRESIDENT BE AUTHORIZED TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER SUCH AGREEMENTS, CONTRACTS, EASEMENTS, AND OTHER DOCUMENTS, CONSENTS, AND/OR APPROVALS AS MAY BE NECESSARY IN FURTHERANCE OF THE PROPOSED AGREEMENT; and THAT THE FINAL FORM OF THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN AGC AND THE CITY BE SUBSTANTIALLY IN CONFORMANCE, IN ALL MATERIAL RESPECTS, WITH THE DRAFT AGREEMENT REVIEWED BY THE BOARD ON THIS DATE."
5. The motion was APPROVED by a vote of 9 in favor, 0 opposed, and 0 abstaining. A roll call vote was recorded as such: Caldwell—Yea, Benskin, Joe—Yea, (proxy votes for Braton & Boyd), Benskin, Mike—Yea, Still—Yea, Harper—Yea, Bonner—Yea, Humbargar—Yea.
6. The meeting was adjourned at approximately 8:15 p.m.

Now that agreement is signed between the city and the gun club, the project, will start soon. I would like to thank our lawyers Scott Levin, Carolyn Abrahams, AGC member Harold Lee, and the City of Aurora Project Manager Lyman Ho for their help with the project. The first part of the project will be to move the power poles back from the Gun Club Road sometime within the next 30 days. The second part will involve laying water pipes in October and November. Once the waterlines are complete, a fiber optic line will be laid parallel to the water line.

A shed will be purchased by the city. This will be the office for the Range Officer during the construction period. The committee of M.Benskin, Bonner, and Caldwell has determined the costs for the office as follows: Shed \$2600, office chair \$125, table \$80, miscellaneous office supplies \$75, and heater (electric or propane) \$250. With a total cost to the city \$3130.00. The city will also pay for range officer's wages during construction. The wage to be paid will be \$12.00 per hour.

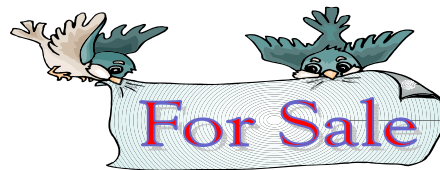
