### IV. MEMBERS FORUM

Fred Smith – Fred announced that today is the 247<sup>th</sup> birthday of the US Army. He said to all past, present and future soldiers – the Navy says Happy Birthday US Army.

Dave Leiker – Dave said he would like to bring back the \$4 Wednesday trap shoots. He has noticed that the club has lost a lot of shooters by not having the \$4 Wednesday trap shoots and it doesn't cost the club anything to bring it back. Dave said the club will make money by bringing it back. Dave Hay said he was the one that suggested we do away with trap Wednesdays because we could not find a replacement chairman and we might as well use coins Monday – Friday. Dave Leiker said there are not as many shooters showing up for trap on Wednesday and they used to have an average of 10+ shooters. He also explained that this past Wednesday was the best in 2 months with 7 shooters. Dave Leiker, Sonny Young and Steve Kelley are willing to run it every Wednesday.

**6.14.2022 c.** Motion to reinstate the Wednesday trap shoot for \$4.00.

Motion seconded and passed 8 to 1, Dave Hay voted no

Matt Grosjean – Matt explained that he owns Centennial Gun Club as well as an AGC member. Centennial Gun Club hosts Dealer Days with a manufacture representatives. They plan to hold a Dealer Day with products on August 13<sup>th</sup> and he would like to rent the 200-yd range and open to all members and non-members to demo products. There are giveaways and he would like to make it an event. The event would run from 10:00 am – 4:00 pm. He is willing condense it and do whatever works best for the club. Matt also said that long term he thinks there are other opportunities for AGC membership if interested. He would also like to incorporate a training course per month and open to club members. This would be the first time doing the training outside of Centennial Gun Club. Dietrich ask about participation if it was at their club – Matt said it's hard to tell how many people initially. He would like to bring opportunities to AGC and the goal would be to intertwine the two clubs if the board is interested. Harold Lee asked if Matt could provide a Certificate of Liability coverage to AGC and Matt said yes. Chris Baker said they would be open to it but will need to work through the logistics of the event(s) and training opportunities. Matt will look at other dates and get back to the board.

Willie Chatman – Willie said he would like to host an AR shoot on Saturday, August 27<sup>th</sup> for AGC members and military guests from Buckley Airforce Base. He would be the primary instructor for the shoot with Steve Chagolla, Dave Hay and Randy Still helping. They would like to use the 100-yd range from 7:30 am and shoot 50 rounds – 25 rounds supported and 25 rounds unsupported. He needs to figure out target stands and scopes for guests. Willie will be paying for everything related to the shoot and he would like the military guests to be free for the event. Chris Baker said he thinks there should be some sort of fee like we do for all events at \$2 for members and \$8 for non-members. Willie said that Buckley Airforce is the reason that AGC is here, and he would like to waive the guest fee for one day for active military. He would like to advertise the event by putting flyers in the berm covers and a banner around his truck. Chris also said Willie's execution of the event sounds good, but he cannot think of any other event that we let people shoot for free and this one should be no different. Manny thought it was a good idea to waive the price or lower it for the day to \$2 for this event and it would be a nice way to give a break to the support the military. Ron Dobbs asked if we would cap the attendees and suggested doing 30 members and 30 non-members. Ron then offered to sponsor the event by covering the fee of \$10 per head at those numbers. Chris Baker asked if this would be an annual event and Willie said no. Stuart Davis asked what the goal was to have 30 members and 30 non-members and Willie said it's because the board suggested those numbers. Stuart suggested having a member sponsor a non-member military shooter to pay the fee.

Our YTD revenue is \$137,694 and our YTD expenses are \$109,209 with a net gain of \$28,485. Clubhouse Renovation Status – Dave Leiker – Dave said he tried his very best to get the permit today. Dave received an email yesterday from Mr. Turner at Arapahoe County and he has not received a release from CDPHE for the asbestos report yet. The contractor had originally sent the asbestos report to Mr. Turner and Mr. Turner told him he needed to resend to CDPHE for review. Dave said with any luck they will hopefully review and approve by next week. Dave talked to Mr. Turner and he said we are ready to go other than the asbestos report approval. Dave also asked the contractor when they can start working on the clubhouse after getting the permit and he said it would be about a week to get the crews together once the permit is received. Dave said he also spoke to David Faingold about trailer toilets being brought in to the club next week and the 3 existing porta potties will be picked up.

Summer BBQ Update – Manny Boyd/Dietrich Whitesides – Manny said he received updated quotes from the same tent company and Hickory House for food for the BBQ. It will cost the club \$1100 more this year from last year. The tent will be setup the evening before at no additional charge and we would allow 1 member plus 3 guests to RSVP. Manny also said if we setup the tent the night before he would like to suspend the 200-yd and silhouette ranges from Friday night through Saturday afternoon to allow for the BBQ setup.

### Civilian Marksmanship Program

Hopefully all members are aware that there is a regularly scheduled AGC Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) rifle match scheduled for the second Saturday of each month throughout the year. These are CMP sanctioned matches following all of the rules regarding rifles and procedures for encouraging safe and fun shooting competition.

These matches consist of 5 sighting shots and 30 rounds for score fired from the prone and off-hand positions at the 100-yard line. Prone consists of a slow fire stage, 5 sighting shots and 10 rounds for score in a time limit of 15 minutes using only a sling for support and a rapid-fire stage consisting of 10 rounds for score including a mandatory reload in a time limit of 80 seconds using a sling. Off-hand is 10 rounds in 10 minutes slow fire unsupported.

Rifles used are any of the CMP As-Issued rifle classes including M1 Garands, Springfield 03 and 30-A3, Foreign Military Bolt action and Modern Military class rifles. Additionally, we allow Unlimited class rifles whose scores are recognized in a separate rifle class. All information regarding acceptable rifles, match format, range procedures and scoring can be accessed through the CMP website at [theCMP.org](http://theCMP.org).

New shooters are encouraged, and coaching will be made available if needed. Hope to see you all at the range.
