CRO's Corner

We blink our eyes and summer is gone. I wanted to remind all members this month about a couple things. First off, when an AGC member brings a guest or guests to the club it is their responsibility to have briefed the guests on the rules of gun safety as well as the rules of the club, specifically of the range they will be shooting at. Secondly, it is incumbent on the member to ensure their guest know how to handle and operate all firearms that are to be used that day. This of course implies the member themselves know these things. We have seen an increased number of rule violations recently. Please reread the range rules one more time, please. I would also like to remind folks that on a range that is flagged, when the flag is down there is to be NO handling of firearms with one and only one exception. The exception is that a previously cased firearm may be brought to or taken from the range, IN THE CASE. Shooters may not uncase or case firearms when the flag is down. Any firearms on the benches, racks or on the tables must not be handled in any way when the flag is down. Read that last sentence one more time please because we have seen this rule broken many times recently. When the flag is down shooters may post targets, collect brass cases and the like so long as firearms are not handled. If you are not posting a target or collecting brass please stand behind the safety line as it shows all others you are waiting for the flag to be raised and are not in need of more time. Once the flag is raised do not proceed in front of the firing line (this means the white line at the 100 yard range in front of the benches or the imaginary line drawn across all the muzzles of firing weapons) for any reason. When running your own range or just shooting with friends and family please ensure all shooters are lined up across the range so no one is in front of others who are firing. Please be safe and ensure those you bring to the range are briefed such that they are operating safely as well. Thank you and have a great October!

OCTOBER 10, 2009 JOHN C GARAND/VINTAGE RIFLE MATCH

This is the final scheduled JCG match at Aurora Gun Club for 2009. In order to mix things up a little bit, I would like to round out the series with a 50 shot match rather than our regular 30 shot match. Because of the time of year, the match will begin at 9:30am. To expedite the match, speed up scoring and allow us to run all stages in 2 relays, I have asked the permission of the BOD to reserve the 100 yd range that Saturday morning.

This match will be shot at targets reduced for 100 yds and consist of 4 scored stages preceded by a 5 shot sighter stage, as follows:

5 sighter shots from the (approved) position of your choice, in 5 minutes

10 shots offhand, slowfire in 10 minutes

10 shots from sitting, in 80 seconds including a reload

10 shots from prone, in 80 seconds including a reload

20 shots from prone, slowfire in 20 minutes

ENTRY FEE: \$15.00 non-AGC members, \$10 AGC members

ENTRY CLOSES: 9:30 AM

FIRING BEGINS: Firing may begin before 9:30 as entries are squaded.

RULES: CMP Competition Rules. Foreign Service rifles in common issue before the year 1955 may participate in the "Vintage Service Rifle" category. No match prepped rifles, no .308 conversions. Participants will provide their own ball equivalent or non-match ammo.

AWARDS: Medals will be awarded to the top 3 places in each of Novice and Experienced class provided at least 5 entries are received for each class.

GENERAL INFORMATION: Participants may wish to bring their own water and snacks. Restrooms and sodas are available in the clubhouse on site.
