AGC Board Member, Dave Faingold - In coordination with the National Trap Shooting Day October 8th, I would like to welcome all shooter enthusiasts; beginning, novice or just need to dust off the old shotgun, to help us promote the shooting sports and exercise our second amendment rights. We will open up a special trap field, either 3 or 4, from 9-1 pm. Hope to see you there!

V. OLD BUSINESS

Financial Report — AGC Treasurer, Tom Desmond — In August our revenues were \$22,079.75 and our expenses were \$18,279.28 leaving a positive net change of \$3,800.47. Our YTD revenue is \$153,285.53 and our YTD expenses are \$180,475.56 leaving a negative year to date change of \$27,190.03. Our account balances: Checking Account \$116,594.32; Payroll Account \$25,627.07; and Savings Account \$337,419.30. Our assets with the JP Morgan Cash Holdings account is \$40,512.10. Our Fixed income account balance is \$304,703.45. Our Alternative Assets balance is \$198,437.07. Total JP Morgan is \$543,652.62.

Maintenance — 2nd VP, John Price — Our caretaker, Richard Parker and I, jacked up the trailer that holds the pallets of birds for shotgun to relieve pressure on the tires as they are in rough shape. The caretakers bathroom upgrade is under way. The snow blowers have been dropped off to prepare for the upcoming season. Rob Stiels and I took approximately 40 lbs of dirt into the south end of the magnum berm to build it up, probably needs 40 more loads. Bill Chin acquired a collapsible shooting bench for use on the 200 yard line. A new sign with prices was placed in the clubhouse above the food items. We are getting some bids on pothole repairs in the drive and club entry.

Incident report — AGC President Emmanuel Boyd - Our Chief Range Officer, Terry Humbargar — is not able to be here tonight and there are no new incidents to report.

The annual Board meeting will be held from 11 am to 12 pm and the entire range will be closed for this hour also. We have three openings and four candidates to choose from. Again this year, the names on the ballot are not listed in alphabetical order. Instead they were randomly drawn and put on the ballot in the order they were drawn. Each candidate will have the opportunity to speak during the board meeting. The meeting will take a recess until elections are done and will start again once the ballots are counted and ready to be announced. A reminder that no one is allowed in the education trailer while the counting is being done.
