VI. OLD BUSINESS

Financial Report — AGC Treasurer, Tom Desmond — In September our revenues were \$19,982.55 and our expenses were \$23,639.12 leaving a negative net change of \$3,656.57. Our YTD revenue is \$173,268.08 and our YTD expenses are \$204,114.68 leaving a negative year to date change of \$30,846.60. Our account balances: Checking Account \$117,587.32; Payroll Account \$17,724.43; and Savings Account \$327,441.07. Our assets with the JP Morgan Cash Holdings account is \$41,653.84. Our Fixed income account balance is \$304,471.54. Our Alternative Assets balance is \$199,036.07. Total JP Morgan is \$545,161.45.

Maintenance — 2nd VP, John Price — This past month, our caretaker Richard and I completed the bathroom in his home. The annual maintenance has been completed on the tractor and the snow blades have been tuned up and is ready for the winter.

VII. NEW BUSINESS

Incident report — AGC Chief Range Officer, Terry Humbargar — there is nothing to report.

Hunters Safety Class Request — AGC President, Emmanuel Boyd — I have been asked if our club will consider offering a Hunters Safety Class. We have had classes in the past but we will not be reopening for this.

Land Sale — AGC 2nd VP, John Price — I was told by a land surveyor that the ten acres of land north of us has sold for \$585,000.00. We are not sure who bought it.

Waiver of AGC Rules — ATA Chairman, Loren Kohler — Asked for confirmation that ATA shoots are exempt from policing their own shells as long as the fields are clean before ending the shoot (rule A12). ATA rules allow for maximum shot size of 7 1/2 and velocity of 1,280 feet per second. That combination exceeds the Club's Rule TR1 of three dram equivalent. The Board agreed that the ATA shoots are exempt from Club Rule A12 as long as the field is clean at the end of the shoot. The Board asked for clarification regarding the distance size 7 1/2 shot of 1 1/8 ounce travels. The ATA Chairman will research the distance shot travels and report back to the Board.

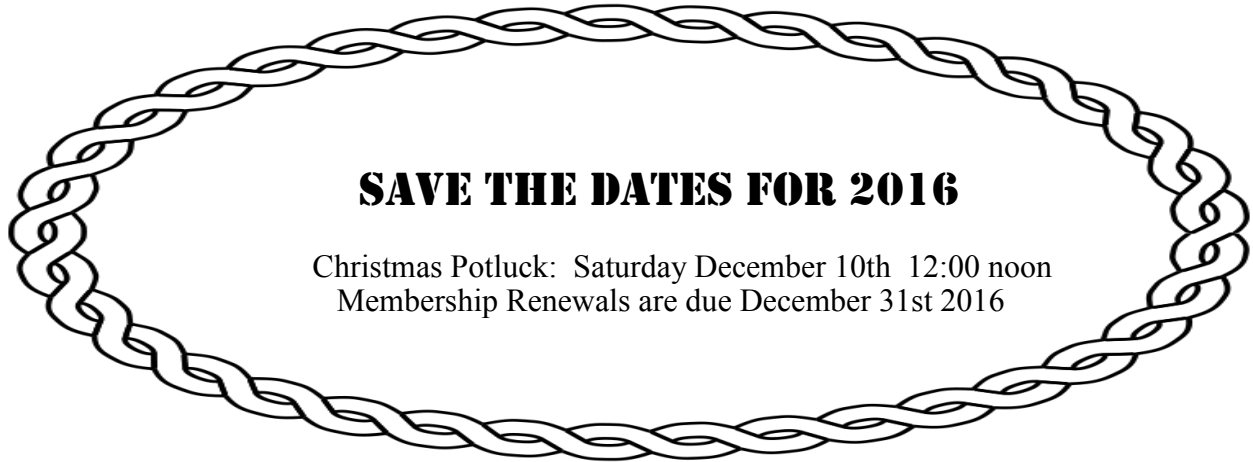
