**DATE(S):** 08:30 AM on Saturday, May 14, 2022. Registration will begin at 08:00.

**LOCATION:** Aurora Gun Club is located at 301 South Gun Club Road, Aurora, CO 80018. The range is easily accessible from I-70 by taking Exit 289 on I-70 (Gun Club Road/E470), and following Gun Club Road south for approximately 2 miles. The entrance to the club will be on your right (west side of the road). You can also Google this address for a map and aerial view.

**ELIGIBILITY:** Any competitor 12 years of age or older and a citizen of the United States may enter this match. CMP rule 4.4.6 states that the age requirement may be waived by the match sponsor upon presentation of proof of the competitor's ability to handle a service rifle safely and complete the match course of fire. You will be required to sign a Waiver/Liability Agreement to participate; minors must have a responsible adult sign on their behalf in order to participate.

**ENTRIES:** Will be made in person on the date of the event.

**ENTRY LIMITATIONS:** 30 competitors (two relays of 15 competitors) maximum accepted for squadding.

**ENTRY FEE:** is payable at the time of registration.

**MATCH FEES:** \$20.00 per participant.

**LIABILITY WAIVER:** An agreement of release/waiver of liability must be signed before the match starts.

**RULES:** The current CMP Competition Rules govern the conduct of this match.

**CLASSIFICATION AND CATEGORIES:** There will be no classifications and categories in this match.

**AWARD SCHEDULE:** CMP Award Pins are offered, standard CMP cut scores will be used as shown:

The CMP has authorized the awarding of Gold, Silver and Bronze pins of the same design as the medals awarded at the National John C. Garand Match, rule 9.3.4. The CMP has established guidelines for local matches using the scores for the National Medals. These are: Gold Medal, 281 & up, Silver Medal, 280-273 and Bronze Medal 272-264. These scores are intended to award medals to approximately the top 40% of the competitors. The CMP realizes that local conditions (WIND, etc.) can cause scores to be

lower than at Camp Perry. Therefore AGC will use these scores as guidelines with a goal of awarding two Gold pins, four Silver pins and six Bronze pins at each match, without regard to the type of rifle fired or new/experienced shooter status. The number of competitors at each match will also be a determining factor in the number of pins awarded. Competitors must be present at the awards ceremony at the end of each match to receive a pin.

The CMP provides Certificates of Competition which will be presented to all competitors desiring them after the end of the awards ceremony. The results bulletin will be emailed after it is posted on the CMP web site (<http://www.odcmp.com/> click on Competition Tracker and the circle for Garand & Springfield Results) to all competitors who have email addresses on their score cards.

CMP RIFLE PURCHASE ELIGIBILITY: The CMP Certificate of Competition in one of these John C. Garand match meets the CMP requirement for proof of marksmanship participation for purchasing rifles from the CMP. SAFETY: Safety is paramount. Each shooter must provide eye and ear protection. Empty Chamber indicators must be used at AGC, and may be purchased at the match for \$1 each.

MINI-CLINIC: As necessary, a short mini-clinic will be held to familiarize new shooters with safety, the match procedures and the operation of their rifle.

COURSE OF FIRE: The John C. Garand Match, Course A (from table 10, rule 9.2.1, of the CMP Competition Rules) will be fired at 100 yards:

Stage 1: Slow fire prone: A maximum of 5 sighting shots with coaching in a time limit of 5 minutes.

Stage 2: Slow fire prone: 10 record shots with coaching for new shooters in a time limit of 10 minutes

Stage 3: Rapid fire prone: 10 record shots in a time limit of 70 (or 80 if there are bolt action rifles being fired) seconds. No alibis will be allowed. Coaching by looking through a spotting scope is not allowed.

Stage 4: Standing: 10 record shots with coaching for new shooters in a time limit of 10 minutes.

Shooters will walk to the targets, which will be pasted up after the 5 sighters. The targets will be scored and pasted up after each 10 round stage of record firing. Shooters will be responsible for scoring the target next to them. Shooters may keep their target after completion of firing.

DISTANCES TO BE FIRED: The competitions will be held on the AGC 100 yard range.

TARGETS: The SR-1, Official 100 yard Military Target (21" X 24") will be used. Each competitor will be issued one target. They will use that target for the entire match and may keep the target after the match is completed. Pastors will be provided for target patching following each stage.

RIFLES: Each competitor should provide his or her rifle which, in accordance with CMP rules 6.3.1 through 6.3.5 and 9.2.2, must be one of: As-issued U. S. Rifle cal..30 M1903, M1903A1 or M1903A3 ("the Springfield"), U. S. Rifle cal..30 M1917 ("the Enfield"), U. S. Rifle cal..30 M1 ("the Garand"), U. S. Rifle cal..30 M1941 ("the Johnson"), the U. S. Krag rifle (cal..30-40) and the U. S. Carbine caliber .30 carbine M1. Foreign rifles meeting the requirements for Vintage Military may also be used in this match (this includes most pre-1955 bolt action rifles). Rule 6.4 states that Match Sponsors may, at their option, allow competitors to fire unlimited and special military rifles. These competitors will be recorded as firing out of competition in accordance with rule 4.11 and will not be eligible to win CMP medals.

AMMUNITION: Any safe ammunition may be fired. Remember to bring two clips or magazines.
